

Hodder was attached to the Brigade Head Quarters and was hit about the end of June by a shell when in his dug out which blew off both his legs. His mate- Gordon Farnhammedressed his wounds and passed him on to the Dressing Station.

He and fite D. Fisher wore on Police Duty at Brigade headquarters on August 6 and were each hit by same shell. Hodder had one or both legs blown off and Fisher lost one or more limbs. Jitness did not see this happen but heard it from mates and regarded it as absolutely true, but could never find out what become of oither of them subsequently.

Witness knew Hodder well: he was acting as policeman at the Brgde H. Stra. Hodder and a man named Fisher were together in a dug out near Tasmaniman Post when a high explosive shell explosed struck the dug out, destroying it and took off both Hodder's legs. Witness saw all this. Fisher was also injured; latter belongs to D Co, loth Battn. Witness is nearly sure this took place in Sept, but he is rather vague as regards date. Hodder and Fisher were taken away and left Peninsula, witness dees not know where they were going. Hodder through Headquarters, but no news came to that effect. Witness was connected with Headquarters. Witness does not know what became of Fisher or where he is now.

Dear Sir,

With reference to your inquiry for -

502 Pte.H.HODDER 10th Be th. who is officially reported wounded and missing at Callipoli since 9.8.15, we regret we have never been able to obtain definite information of his death and buriel, and doubt whether it will ever be possible to do so, as there are few reliable records available of that time. We are forwarding two unofficial reports we have on our books concerning him.

305 Cpl.A.H.Mills states "About the end of September Hodder had both legs blown off by a 9.2 and I gaw him afterwards being taken down to Anzac Beads, and it is certain he died on a hospital ship." In this case he would of course have been buried at seq.

131 Sgt. Heave made the following statement "Hodder was hadly hit by a shell exploding in his dugont behind the trenches to the right of Lone Pane. He died in the dressing stati n on the beach." Informant received the above account of Hodders death from Pte. J. Thomas, stretcher bearer 10th A.I.F.

Should we receive any further information concerning your brother's place of burial we shall at once advise you, but we fear

there is little hope of any coming to hand.
