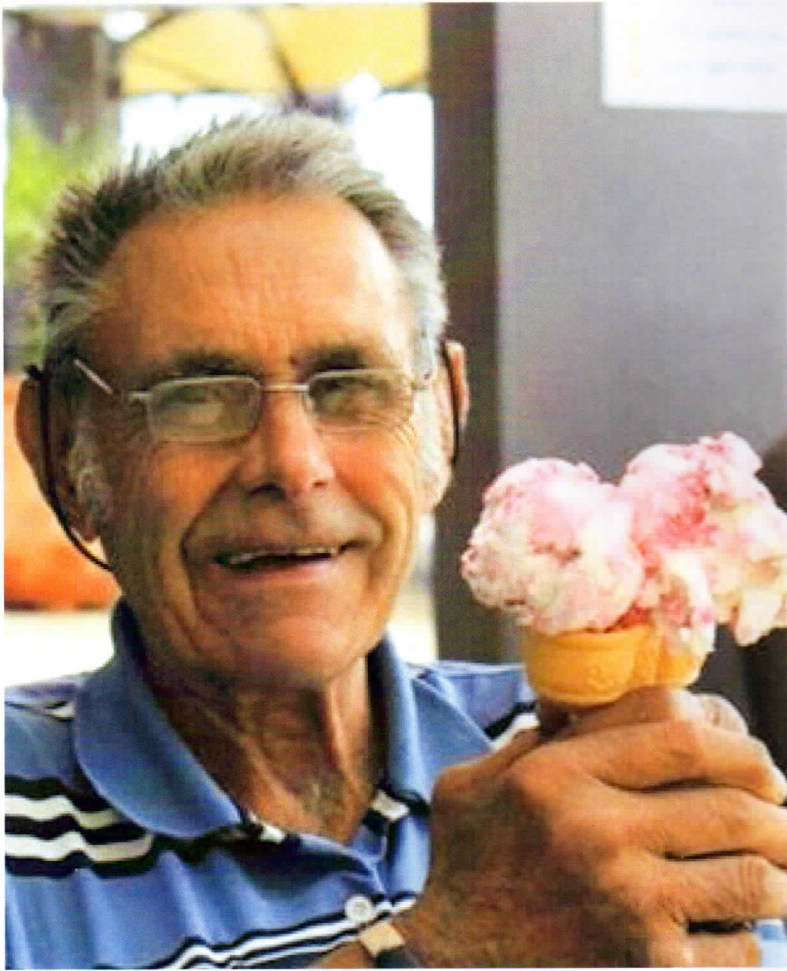

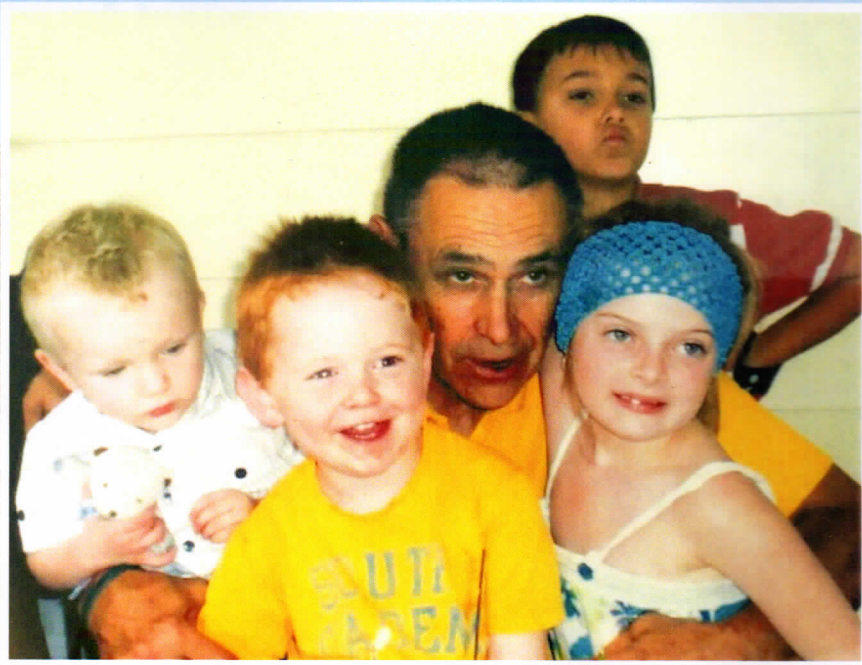

JOINED NSW POLICE FORCE AS  
CADET NO. 1946 ON 11TH MAY 1964  
AND CARRIED OUT HIS CADET  
TRAINING AT THE TRAFFIC OFFICE  
MAIL ROOM, AND DARLINGHURST  
AND PHILLIP STREET POLICE  
STATIONS.

ON 16 MAY 1966 HE COMMENCED  
TRAINING AT THE POLICE TRAINING  
COLLEGE.

HE THEN SERVED AT MAROUBRA,  
POLICE TRAFFIC BRANCH, GOSFORD  
CHATSWOOD, PYMBLE, WOY WOY, GOSFORD  
AGAIN AND RETIRED AT WYONG  
POLICE STATION ON 6 APRIL 1995.

DURING THIS TIME KEITH ROSE TO  
THE RANK OF SERGEANT.

HE WAS AWARDED THE NATIONAL

MEDAL IN 1982

THE 1ST CLASP TO THE NATIONAL

MEDAL IN 1992

THE NSW POLICE MEDAL WITH 4TH
